
JUNE MEETING



Sensei David Nguy did a demonstration on Black Pine Summer Work. Sensei David stated that Black Pine Bonsai Trees need to be worked on twice a year in the Summer and Winter. Summer work should be done in June and July.

ADDITIONAL MEETING NOTES

Summer work includes the decandling of the Black Pine. When decandling, for weaker trees you decandle earlier in the summer and strong trees can be decandled later in the summer. This timing will help weaker trees become stronger the following year.



When decandling Black Pine, cut in three stages to balance the energy of the tree. Start by decandling the bottom third of the tree, 10 days later decandle the middle third area and then 10 days later decandle the top third area. We cut the bottom candles first to give more time for new shoots to come out. The bottom third of the tree needs more needles to increase energy. If you cut all candles at the same time, the top of the tree will be too strong and will and keep the bottom parts of the tree weak.



Cut the candles at the base of the new shoot. If you don't cut at the base, a stub will grow on the branch and no new shoot will grow.

By properly decandling your Black Pine trees every summer, you can ensure your trees will have same size needles in the future.
